## Assessment Update

### Standards in Religious Education – New Interim Assessment Framework July 2018

As you are aware there has been a lot of consultation on developing a new national framework for assessing religious education. After an initial questionnaire, it was clear that schools needed a new assessment tool that reflected the changes in the broader education landscape and the need to move from 'Levels' to age-related expectations. In secondary schools, the new GCSE has raised the bar for examination at the end of KS4 and as a result, the assessment at KS3 needs to better prepare pupils for the more demanding study at GCSE.

The new Interim document is a response to these needs and although it represents a move forward, there is still work to be done, in order for it to fully equip schools in their task of assisting pupils to make progress in religious education. After carrying out a short pilot, the results showed that schools would still like to see:

- end of year expectations, rather than phase ones;  
***In Arundel & Brighton the pilot schools worked hard together and have developed alongside the phase document an end of year document that is more in-line with other core curriculum subject assessment and tracking.***
- annotated examples of pupil and student work that exemplify each Age-Related Standard;
- an indication of how the Interim Age-Related Standards is to be used to measure progress for data tracking purposes and pupil feedback: something like performance scales;
- in secondary schools, an indication of how the Interim Age-Related Standards (3-19) relate to the GCSE grades at the end of KS4.

To further respond to these needs, the CES and working party will continue to meet throughout the academic year 2018-2019 and will continually seek information from schools on how they are using the document, and the improvements that can be made.

In addition, the Bishops of the Department of Catholic Education and Formation have commissioned a third edition of the Religious Education Curriculum Directory (RECD) this will bring the full revision of both the curriculum and standards to its completion. The expected publication date for the revised RECD is September 2020.

In this interim period, from now until September 2020, the Bishops Department has given permission for dioceses to continue to use the historical *Levels of Attainment in Religious Education* or for schools to use the new *Interim Age-Related Standards (3-19) in Religious Education*. In Arundel and Brighton, we are encouraging schools to use the new Interim Age-Related Standards (3-19) either the end of phase document or the end of year document that has been developed using the standards in the end of phase document.

Details of the new Interim document and the Arundel & Brighton End of Year document will be introduced to all RE Coordinators during their first CPD Day on **Friday 12<sup>th</sup> October 2018** and then further information, for all those interested in the new assessment, especially all staff responsible for teaching RE, on how the document can be used to inform planning, set targets, track pupil progress and report to senior leaders, will be shared during training at DABCEC on **Monday 15<sup>th</sup> October 2018** 9:30am - 15:15pm .

Schools should ensure that assessment procedures for RE are in-line with assessment procedures for all other core-curriculum subjects. It is advisable for those who wish to remain using the Levels of Attainment to continue with the formal assessment tasks at the end of a topic, three times per school year. For those using the Age-Related end of year statements, it is advisable to assess progress across a whole topic and the child's developing skills in relation to their age and stage of learning.

Both assessment documents use 'Driver words' to support where the pupil is working and the skills they are obtaining. From this, targets can be easily set to ensure progress is continual.

Some assessment tasks can be found in RE Resources. These assessment tasks should be moderated in school, at deanery level if possible, and at the end of year RE Coordinators' diocesan moderation meeting. Individual tasks are not intended to be the only source of evidence, as continual AFL is best practice and not one-off judgments but they can be used as a valued resource to form part of a 'wider picture'.

These are becoming very popular with schools.


For Primary and Secondary Schools led by costumed Wintershall actors.




